Dear Parents/Carers,

We are very much looking forward to welcoming all children back to school in September. We have been awaiting government guidance about school reopening (which was issued yesterday) in order to progress our plans for your child's return to Bishop Road. We are currently finalising these arrangements and, before the end of next week, will send information to all families about the wider reopening plans.

Pupil Reports this year will also be emailed out to families. Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 reports will be sent on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July and Year 3 – 6 will be sent on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> July.

Those families with children in Years 2, 3 and 4 have received a letter detailing the arrangements for 'Meet the Teacher' sessions on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> July. The teachers are all looking forward to welcoming their classes back and introducing them to their new teacher for September. A reminder that if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 5, their 'Meet the Teacher' sessions will take place as part of their normal school day on either Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> July (Group A) or Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> July (Group B). A further confirmation is that on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> July all families will receive an email confirming the name of your child's new class teacher.

The final day of the school year usually involves party games and food. Teachers are adapting their plans for the day to ensure children can enjoy playing games and eating food together. Although it will not be possible for children to share food in the same way, we invite you to pack some 'party food' for your child as part of their packed lunch for them to enjoy on their last day of term. Please remember all food must be nut free.

## Holiday Club


