Story Writing Competition

Katherine Rundell, author of Rooftoppers and The Explorer, has challenged children across the country to write an adventure story starring their favourite book character. The challenge is to create a story about what happened to your favourite book character before their book began. On World Book Day (Thursday 4th March), children will participate in a book-related quiz during their daily Zoom or in class. We will also be launching Bishop Road Primary School's Masked Reader, featuring some familiar faces from around the school. Alongside the challenges and activities that will be going on in school, the <u>World Book Day website</u> has a huge variety of book related activities that children could complete at home. As usual, children will receive a book token, which entitles them to one free World Book Day book or £1 off a book or audio book of their choice.
