Covid measures

We are continuing to follow government guidance to reduce transmission, the greatest tools remaining hand washing and keeping classes separate, both inside and outside. Unlike many of the other aspects of wider life that are opening up this week, collection and drop off are not optional for parents and carers and social distancing is difficult. It is for this reason we continue to take a cautious approach to wearing face coverings.
