Enjoy spending some time doing some reading. You can read your school reading book to an adult and discuss the story, events and characters you have come to know. You can always use the pictures to help you talk about the story.

Tips to help with Reading

Reading Strategies: Pause, Prompt and Praise

PAUSE to help them work out the new words

PROMPT by using some of the reading techniques

PRAISE them for trying whether they are right or wrong

- Talk about the book before you begin to read - look at the front cover, and the pictures (if any) and ask the child to think about or even guess what the book may be about.
- Ask questions to check the child's understanding e.g. What might happen next? Why did something happen?
- Talk about the book afterwards - did the child enjoy it? Why? What was the best bit?
- Tell the child one thing you really enjoy about listening to them read.
