
#### Year 3 remote learning - Day 12 Term 3

# English - 45 minutes

In Year 3, we are reading The Abominables as our novel in English! You might recognise this extract from the third chapter:

Lucy got back safely to the valley - sleepwalkers usually seem to get back to their beds. But the glacier she had walked across had just had a new fall of snow. And right



across it, from end to end, she left a row of footprints: eight toes, rounded heels and all. There is nothing like a portly yeti with flat feet for making marks which even a nitwit could identify.

If only it had snowed, then things might have gone on as before. But it didn't snow, not the next day or the next. And on the third day a couple of climbers came across the prints.

Within a week photographs of Lucy's footprints were on the front page of newspapers all over the world. All the old stories about Abominable Snowmen were dragged out again: how fierce they were, how huge.... How they could swallow three goats at a gulp, how just to see one was to die within the week.

Today you are going to be writing one of these newspaper articles about the discovery of the yeti footprints. You need to make it sound like an incredible and exciting discovery!

- Introduce the discovery explain what was found, who found it, when they found it etc.
- Remember, no-one will be sure exactly what the prints are from you can include the theory that they are from a Yeti/Abominable Snowman, but it needs to be presented as a guess rather than a known fact.
- Get some quotes from people maybe there could be a quote from one of the climbers who found the prints; maybe there could be another from an expert on Himalayan wildlife.





Enjoy spending half an hour doing some reading. You could read to yourself or to somebody else, or perhaps a mixture of both!


Try to read a range of different texts through your time at Bishop Road. Some ideas include:


- Stories

#### Music 30-45 minutes


