
Year 3 remote learning - Day 7 Term 3

English - 45 minutes

In Year 3, we are reading The Abominables as our novel in English! You might recognise this extract from the second chapter:

The first thing Agatha did, naturally, was to teach all the yetis to talk. Father learnt to speak quite quickly even though he was over three hundred years old by



the time Agatha came to the valley and it is not so easy to learn new things as you get older. And of course the children learnt as easily as they breathed.

After that, Agatha taught them all the things that her governess had taught her, like the importance of good manners: not burping after meals, not scratching under the armpits however much one itched, and never closing one's ear lids when people were speaking to one. She taught them how to clean between their teeth with a sharpened stick, and how to wash their eight-toed, backward-pointing feet in the stream after they'd been running because smelly feet are not polite. She taught them sums and their alphabet and how to sing hymns. Best of all, she used to tell them stories.

Today you are going to write a set of instructions for teaching Yetis how to be good and upstanding citizens! As part of your instructions, you might want to include many of the things which Agatha chose to teach them, as in the extract above. However, you might also think that there are other important things to teach Yetis!

- Start with an introduction explaining what the instructions are for and why they are important.
- Use bullet points to separate your instructions. Make sure you include <u>how</u> to teach them how to do something. If you just said 'Teach them to read', the person reading it might not know where to begin! Instead, you could say, 'Starting with simple words, teach the Yetis how to read. Build up to helping them to read whole books, giving them a hand with the tricky words.'
- Think about anything you would need e.g. books, sharpened stick for the teeth cleaning etc.

Reading - 30 minutes

Try to read a range of different texts through your time at Bishop Road. Some ideas include:

Science 30-45 minutes

Our science topic this term is 'Light'. As you may well have learnt already this term, light travels in straight lines. If it hits something opaque, it cannot travel through it, so a shadow is created where the light has been blocked off.

We see shadows all around us on sunny days - here are a few examples:

Top tip - if you are going to make models, make sure you use thick or dark coloured paper/card, otherwise some of the light will pass through it and the shadows won't be as dark!
