<b>Round 3:</b> <b>Mystery</b> <b>Spellings</b> Learn the rule. You will be tested on 5 more words which follow this week's rule.	Most prefixes are added to the beginning of root words without any changes in spelling  <b>re-</b> means 'again' or 'back'. <b>sub-</b> means 'under'. <b>inter-</b> means 'between' or 'among'.	Most prefixes are added to the beginning of root words without any changes in spelling  <b>super-</b> means 'above'. <b>anti-</b> means 'against'. <b>auto-</b> means 'self' or 'own'.	The suffix <b>-ation</b> is added to verbs to form nouns.  If the noun ends with -ne, -ve, or - re, remove the 'e' before the suffix is added.	The suffix <b>-ly</b> is added to an adjective to form an adverb. It starts with a consonant letter, so it is added straight on to most root words.  Exception 1) If the root word ends in -y with a consonant letter before it, the y is changed to i.  Exception 2) If the root word ends with -le, the -le is changed to -ly.	The suffix <b>-ly</b> is added to an adjective to form an adverb. It starts with a consonant letter, so it is added straight on to most root words.  Exception 3) If the root word ends with -ic, -ally is added rather than just -ly, except in the word <i>publicly</i> .  Exception 4) The words <i>truly</i> , <i>duly</i> , <i>wholly</i> .
