## **General Reminders**

- Please ensure you visit or call the school office if you need to update any information we presently hold, regarding contact details, care plans, medication, epi-pens, dietary etc. We ask parents/carers to ensure all inhalers, epi-pens and medication held in school are within date.

All Year 6 accounts will be reviewed at the end of this term. Where possible we will move any credit to a younger sibling's account. When this is not possible, we will raise cheques for the balance and send these to you in September 2023.
- Lost property is stored under the shelter, between the Grant and Boat playgrounds. You are free to
  check these boxes every day at drop off and pick-up. All named items are returned where
  possible, to the relevant pupil. We urge you to name every item that comes into school from water
  bottles to shoes.
- Please support us by making every effort to ensure your children has everything they need when they arrive at school each day. Items delivered late to the office are increasing and this is an unnecessary use of staff time reuniting items with children across the school.
