Round 3: Mystery Spellings Learn the rule. You will be tested on 5 more words which follow this week's rule.	Most prefixes are added to the beginning of root words without any changes in spelling re- means 'again' or 'back'. sub- means 'under'. inter- means 'between' or 'among'.	Most prefixes are added to the beginning of root words without any changes in spelling super- means 'above'. anti- means 'against'. auto- means 'self' or 'own'.	The suffix -ation is added to verbs to form nouns. If the noun ends with -ne , -ve , or - re , remove the 'e' before the suffix is added.	The suffix -ly is added to an adjective to form an adverb. It starts with a consonant letter, so it is added straight on to most root words. Exception 1) If the root word ends in -y with a consonant letter before it, the y is changed to i . Exception 2) If the root word ends with -le , the -le is changed to -ly .	The suffix -ly is added to an adjective to form an adverb. It starts with a consonant letter, so it is added straight on to most root words. Exception 3) If the root word ends with -ic , -ally is added rather than just -ly , except in the word <i>publicly</i> . Exception 4) The words <i>truly</i> , <i>duly</i> , <i>wholly</i> .
